Hello,

I thought i would share a debugging technique I've found useful. Note, that I've only tried this in Firefox. In your javascript code you can keep track of what your variables are doing unobtrusively by writing them in the Firebug console. I find this method preferable to using alert windows. Example script:

```

var myValue = 1;

console.log(myValue);
myValue++;
console.log(myValue);
myValue++;
console.log("Final value is " + myValue);
    
```
