Hi Pam,

Well, I worked on this last night after reading your post. I came up with an alternate solution using insertBefore rather than appendChild.

So basically, you fetch the browseCatalog and selectDepartment using getElementById.

Then you createElement h1 and createTextNode text.

Then you do the following two commands:

```
browseCatalogNode.insertBefore(h1Node, selectDepartmentNode);
```

```
h1Node.appendChild(textNode);
```

You are basically inserting the h1 before the selectDepartment and then attaching the text to the h1.

Works great and it was cool to learn a new command.

Or you can just add a new division as per our instructor.
